9 non-profits to receive grants

The New Hampshire Charitable Foundation's Manchester Region has awarded nine Community Impact Grants to non-profit organizations totalling \$92,500.

The Way Home of Manchester received a \$15,000 grant to continue work abating lead paint poisoning in aging, substandard or deteriorating homes.

Other grant awards were made to:

- New Hampshire Legal Assistance — \$15,000, to support the Manchester Child Health Law Program for low-income children and families.

- Makin' It Happen Coalition for Resilient Youth — \$15,000 to encourage civic involvement and substance abuse prevention.

- New Hampshire Public Radio — \$15,000 to support an in-depth look at the diverse student community at Central High School.

- City Year — \$10,000 to expand the program to middle school children in Manchester.

- Manchester Neighborhood Housing Services — \$7,500 to support affordable housing outreach in Goffstown, Londonderry and New Boston.

- Bedford Youth Performing Company — \$5,000 for a summer internship program to provide music, dance and theatre programs to children from low-income families.

- Manchester Community Music School — \$5,000 to help fund a new website.

- YWCA of Manchester — \$5,000 to address teen dating violence.

The Spring cycle of the foundation's Community Impact Grant Program provided \$1.5 million in 120 grants to non profits throughout New Hampshire. The next grant deadline is Sept. 1.
